1) State and local officials are increasingly monitoring impacts on water supplies and enforcement of the Clean Water Act. Animal waste runoffs are being looked at more closely, and property owners could be fined – along with the neighborhood HOA, in which case the penalty would be passed along to all residents, not just dog owners.

2) The appearance and quality of common areas/green spaces impact home sales—not just whether and for how much they sell, but how quickly.


3) The more residents complain about dog waste, the more time the HOA property manager must spend on enforcement rather than serving the association.

A Word from our Property Manager

Waterford will kick off the 2016 pool season on **Saturday**, **May 28th**. We have been unable to update our web site to reflect this opening date, and we apologize to anyone who has been inconvenienced by the outdated information. The heated pool and new filtration system should ensure a wonderful Memorial Day weekend for all who have been eagerly awaiting the new season. Also, please keep in mind that **Monday**, **May 30th will be open to all Waterford residents**, whether you are a pool member or not. The only thing we ask is that you **bring a proof of residency** if you are not a pool member.

The enjoyment of the pool and the safety of everyone are top concerns. With that in mind, we would like to emphasize a few items to make the pool experience a fun time for all.

- If your child is in diapers, please make certain they are wearing swim proof diapers.
- Please monitor your children so the tossing of objects (e.g., footballs or other items that may hurt someone inadvertently) is done in the front lawn, away from smaller children.
- No glass objects of any kind are allowed in the pool area. Beverages should be in either plastic or metal containers. Even if you use a plastic cup to pour your drink into from a glass container, the glass may not be brought onto the pool deck. Please understand that if glass breaks on the pool deck, we must adhere to Health department regulations, which may involve the complete draining of the pool to be cleaned. The thought of closing the pool for a week to do this is not something any of your fellow members will appreciate. Also, the cost of this procedure may be charged to the responsible party. Do not bring glass objects into the pool area.
- Obey the lifeguards. We have a great team and your safety is at the top of their priorities. Also, their job is protect you and your children. They cannot be expected to babysit children.

The clubhouse hours Monday - Thursday are 3:00pm to 7:00pm and Friday hours are 8:00am to 12 noon. Saturday hours will be 11:00am to 3:00pm. We will be available to take pictures for photo IDS and accept new applications. These hours will be in affect through the first of July.

Moody Dues

Waterford HOA dues statements were mailed to all households in early January, and thanks to all who have already paid. The Board voted the dues to <u>remain at \$200</u> for the calendar year. Late fees (\$25) will be added on April 1, July 1, October 1 or January 1 (2017) if not paid by then.

Neighborhood Improvements

There have been several improvements in the neighborhood – some more noticeable than others. Here's a sampling:

- Improvements to lighting system at the main entrance to the neighborhood.
- Purchase and installation of a new pump and fountain nozzle for the lower pond.
- Replacement of the swimming pool filtration system.
- Construction of new storage for pool chemicals to reduce corrosion of the pool pumping system.
- Construction of a length of sidewalk at the Clearwater and Watertrace intersection to reduce walking distance to the clubhouse.
- Removal of honeysuckle from the green space.
- Ceiling and door repairs in the clubhouse.
- Installation of two new benches at the lower pond.
- Stocking both the upper and lower ponds with fish.

More will be done as time and resources permit, and we invite you to join us as volunteer opportunities are posted on Facebook. Thanks to all for the suggestions and help.

Keep Locking Those Cars

Remember, if you park outside your garage, don't leave valuables in sight – better yet, remove them from your car altogether. - Graduated from the University of Kentucky where he was active with the tennis programs from 1997-2005.
- Coached with both the men's and women's tennis teams including the 2005 women's team which won the SEC Championship.
- Coached Jesse Witten for many years during which Witten played in all four grand slams including a 2009 run when Witten won 5 matches in a row to reach the 3rd round of the U.S. Open where he lost a close match to Novak Djokovic in 4 sets.
- Thompson has also worked with multiple players who have been ranked #1 in their age group in the USTA rankings, as well as other pros including players inside the top 10 in the world in doubles.
- The last few years while teaching all age groups, he has also been working with Eric Quigley the UK all American. Currently, Thompson is the Head Tennis Pro at Bluegrass Racquet Club. Thompson has also had an ATP doubles ranking as a player.

Let's Keep in Touch

Web Site. Our web site (waterfordlexington.com) is the primary source of information of a reference nature. You can also find announcements from the Board/Staff, upcoming events, and several methods for contacting our Board Members and Property Manager. We recommend that you register to access the information stored in the "Members Area" (Board meeting minutes, financial statements) and to receive this newsletter directly via e-mail.

E-mail. Only newsletters and events of high importance (e.g., special meetings and Board elections) will be announced through e-mail; other announcements will normally pass through other channels. We do not and will not sell or share your e-mail information.

Twitter. The Board have a Twitter feed (@waterfordlexky) that is used for announcements of a short-term nature (Board meetings, pool closures, construction in the neighborhood, etc.). If you are a Twitter user and "follow" us, you will receive these announcements automatically.

Facebook. Our Facebook group is our most interactive way of communicating with all our neighbors and is used by residents on a daily basis. You will need a Facebook personal profile (which can be highly customized in terms of your privacy settings) to join the group, which you can locate by logging in to Facebook and searching for Waterford in the upper-left search field – it should be the first entry and shows up as "Waterford Closed Group - xxx members." This is a closed group, meaning you will have to request permission to join. Access is limited to Waterford residents, and the discussions are private in the sense that only other group members can read and/or post comments. The Facebook group is a very successful communication tool, and we now have over 360 group members who visit to discuss such wide-ranging topics as baby-sitter recommendations, yard sales, lost pets and social events.

tornado has been detected by Doppler radar or reported by an observer.

The strongest tornadoes, classified as EF5, can have wind speeds of over 300 miles per hour – about three times as fast as a major league fastball. Fortunately, only about 1 in 1000 tornadoes is an EF5.

Tornadoes usually move at less than 35 miles per hour, but can move as fast as 70 miles per hour.

'Tis the Season

We've already had some tense moments with the weather, but more are possible in the coming months. Here are some suggestions to help keep you and your loved ones safe in the event of violent weather.

- Monitor local news, NOAA weather radio, or a weather app that's enabled to send real-time notice of tornado watches and warnings. Be alert to a siren as an indication of a tornado warning. Our nearest siren is at Veterans Park.
- Know where to go. The safest places in your home are basements or a first-floor interior room with no windows.
- Make sure everyone knows where to go, and practice taking shelter regularly.
- If you're outdoors, seek shelter as above basements or interior, windowless rooms of sturdy buildings.
- If you're in a car, drive to the nearest shelter. If you see large objects flying past, though, you're out of time. Be sure your seat belt is on, keep your head down below the windows, and cover your head with your hands and any other suitable material that's available. If you can safely reach ground that's lower than the roadway (for example, a deep ditch), exit your vehicle and lie in that area with your hands covering your head.
- Have a family plan for where and how to reestablish contact afterward.
